

# Winter Volunteer & Mountain Host programs at Laurel Summit



Thinking of becoming a **Winter Volunteer or Mountain Host at Laurel Summit** (just off Route 30 between Laughlintown and Jennerstown)?

- As a Winter Volunteer, you make visitors feel welcome by helping with opening the Warming Hut, stocking and servicing the snack area, keeping the fire going, giving trail advice, etc. You are also registered as a DCNR volunteer.
- As a Mountain Host, you are able to work closely with Laurel Summit Nordic Patrol by being trained in basic first aid and CPR and render aid along side the Patrollers, participate with Patrollers in searches for lost visitors, and join the National Ski Patrol.

The Warming Hut is staffed most weekends in the winter. One would need to commit to a minimum of 2-4 hours each month The Winter Volunteer program is mostly for the winter time. The Mountain Host programs trains throughout the year.
